## La Topa

The first toque of the Oru Seco is dedicated to Eleguá. It has five sections and five calls. Call 2 is within Section 1 and is not a transition. It only requires a response from the itótele and may be played more than once. There is a direct transition into and out of Section 2, requiring only a slight change in the iyá pattern, that leads back to Section 1. Call 3 leads into Section 3. Call 4 leads into Section 4. Call 5 leads into Section 5, Apukenke. La Topa segues directly into Ogundere at the end of Section 5 when the iyá player makes the initial call at the new tempo into that toque.
